 Introduction Does the teacher state the objective? "Hook" used to engage students? Does the teacher relate the lesson to student's prior knowledge or experiences? 	
 Modeling Did the teacher model the skill or concept? Did the teacher ask questions and allow students to ask questions to check for understanding? 	
 Guided Practice What did the teacher do to give students "At bats" opportunities to practice the skill or concept introduced? Did the teacher use scaffolding during instruction? Did the teacher use any type of grouping during the lesson? Did the teacher use open-ended questions, inviting students to think? What are some of the questions the teacher asked the students? Did the teacher encourage student participation, calling on all students? 	
 Independent Practice What activity or assignment did the teacher give the students to complete independently (homework, etc.)? 	
 Closure Did the teacher bring closure to the lesson? What did the teacher do to bring closure to the lesson? Did the teacher review or discuss with the students the objective(s) for the lesson?
