PROGRAM NOTES

Winter from "The Four Seasons"...... A. Vivaldi/Arr by. D. Monday "The Four Seasons" is a set of violin concertos that represent the different scenes and characteristic of each of the four seasons. This arrangement of Winter utilizes the form of a "concerto grosso". Sections will alternate between a small group of players, called the "concertino", and the full group, called the "ripieno". The first violin concertino represents the solo violin part from the original composition. A poem describes the character of the first movement: *To tremble in the cold of the icy snow, in the harsh breath of a horrid wind, to run stamping one's feet every moment, our teeth chattering in the extreme cold.*

Merry Spanish ChristmasArr. by P. Hall This piece utilizes the melody of two Spanish Christmas carol, known as the *villancico*. "Fum, Fum, Fum" and "Riu, Riu". *Villancicos* are very rhythmic and dance-like in character, expressing the joy of the season. The *villancico* is very similar in form and use to the English carol.

Rudoph the Red-Nosed Reindeer Arr. by E. Morales The challenge in creating an arrangement of this Christmas classic was finding a way to make it interesting for the listener while maintaining the integrity of the original melodies and harmonies. Pizzicato (plucking the strings) technique in the introduction is used to convey a snowy, wintery landscape. Angular motion is used throughout to communicate a similar feeling of reindeer flying through a snowy evening sky.

Dance of the Reed Pipes from "The Nutcracker"......P.I. Tchaikovsky/Arr. by R. Frost "The Nutcracker" is Tchaikovsky's third and final ballet that premiered in St. Petersburg in 1892. It was based on Alexander Dumas' adaptation of a story by E.T.A. Hoffman, and tells the story of a young girl named Clara who receives her most cherished Christmas present---a nutcracker—during a Christmas party. A series of fantasies occur throughout the ballet, including toys coming to life, a battle with an army of mice, and the nutcracker's transformation into a price who takes Clara to his Kingdom of Sweets.

A Charlie Brown Christmas. David Benoit/Arr. by L. Moore (Synopsis from IMDB.com) "A Charlie Brown Christmas" is a TV short that was released by CBS in 1965. It Won an Emmy Award for "Outstanding Children's Program", and a Peabody Award for excellence in programming. It tells the story of a boy named Charlie brown who complains about the overwhelming materialism of Christmas that he sees amongst everyone during the Holiday season. To this, Lucy suggests that he become director of the school Christmas pageant. Charlie Brown accepts, but it proves to be a frustrating struggle. When an attempt to restore the proper spirit with a forlorn little fir Christmas tree fails, he needs Linus' help to learn what the real meaning of Christmas.

A Christmas Festival L. Anderson Leroy Anderson was born in Cambridge, Massachusetts, in 1908. He became the director of the Harvard Band in 1930. His arrangements for the band brought him to the attention of Arthur Fiedler, conductor of the Boston Pops. It was Fiedler who premiered his early arrangements and his first original pieces. And it was this relationship that helped establish Anderson's career as a composer of light orchestral music. "A Christmas Festival" is a medley of Christmas favorites scored for full orchestra.
