

Throughout the Day

Restroom:

- 1. We will take a restroom break every hour.

Turning in Work:

- 1. 10 minutes before dismissal, all students will check their work for Heading Papers procedure
- 2. Turn your papers into Mr. Shroyer's Mailbox

Dismissal:

- 1. At the five minute warning, clean your desk
- 2. Pick up trash on the floor, three steps around your desk
- 3. Stack your chair on desk
- 4. Wait quietly for MY dismissal. "Have a wonderful evening!"

How The Procedures Are Taught

The classroom procedures will be taught very simply in three steps: explain, rehearse, and reinforce.

- Explain: I will explain the procedure, demonstrate the steps, and show you how the procedure is to be done.
- 2. Rehearse: **You** will **practice** the procedure. I will help you do it **correctly**.
- 3. Reinforce: We will repeat the first two steps as often as we need to for the whole class to understand the procedures. The goal is for the procedure to be a simple routine for the whole class.

- They provide our classroom with structure.
- They save time and limit confusion.
- They help the class run smoothly.
